## MAKE MAHACKENO **HAPPEN!**

The journey to a new facility began in earnest in 2003. For years, Westport residents saw red and white signs with bold black letters calling for a new YMCA. But there was also significant opposition. Public meetings were often packed with residents voicing support or protest, and lawns across town were lined with signs either promoting or opposing the project, which had been dubbed 'Y Downtown' or 'Make Mahackeno Happen.'



While everyone agreed that Westport needed its YMCA, the Y's future was uncertain without a new facility to meet the community's evolving needs. After years of effort, on February 25, 2013, Westport officials granted Turner Construction a building permit to move forward with the plans for a 54,000-square-foot facility. The project, totaling \$38.5 million, culminated in the opening of the new building in 2014.







Looking back, one thing was clear: we needed a new facility. While the old Y held so much history, it had long since passed its prime. 'Imagining The Possibilities' of a new Y was the easy part, but 'Making Mahackeno Happen' was a much greater challenge. We faced countless town board meetings, state agencies, court trials, and the daunting task of selling our downtown property. Through it all, we had three CEOs and numerous internal committee meetings to guide us. What many people may not realize is how close we came to giving up on the dream. It took a leap of faith for the Directors and Trustees to unanimously vote to move forward, even when we weren't sure how we'd fund the project. It also took thousands of hours from our dedicated staff, volunteers, and supporters, who refused to imagine Westport without the Y.

## **BEDFORD FAMILY SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY FUND** AWARDS \$315,000 TO 33 LOCAL NONPROFITS

In 2024, 33 local nonprofit organizations that received grants totaling \$315,000 through the Bedford Family Social Responsibility Fund (BFSRF).

This year's ceremony celebrated the continued legacy of Ruth T. Bedford, whose generous gift in 2015 created the Bedford Family Social Responsibility Fund. Ruth T. Bedford, a longtime YMCA trustee emeritus and philanthropist, made this transformative gift to enhance educational opportunities and strengthen the communities she loved. Her grandfather, Edward T. Bedford, established the first Westport YMCA in 1923, and her family's unwavering support helped shape the YMCA

into the vital community institution it is today.

The awarded grants will be used to fund educational initiatives that create lasting opportunities for young people. They were recognized for their dedication to closing educational gaps and offering transformative experiences for children and young adults in the Westport, Weston, Bridgeport, Fairfield, Norwalk, and Wilton communities.

Thanks to the generosity of Ruth T. Bedford's estate, we are able to provide critical funding to these organizations, whose work truly makes a difference in the lives of young people and it is an honor to continue Ruth Bedford's legacy of support, ensuring that the YMCA can be a leader in community impact for years to come.

At the 2024 YMCA Masters Nationals, 58 WWFY swimmers delivered standout performances, breaking seven national records and capturing first place overall for the second year in a row. The women's team took first, the men's team placed third, and four relay teams highlighted the strength of our community and commitment to excellence.

At the 37th Annual Swim Across the Sound Marathon, our Water Rats and Masters Swim Team raised over \$58,000— \$48,000 from WRAT Masters alone—demonstrating extraordinary endurance and a deep commitment to community and cause.






